

Minister's Moment

Recently, I was talking to the minister at First United Methodist after a ROSM board meeting, and he told me about an interesting book that he was introduced to at a conference. He went on to tell me more about the book and that he is leading a study on it at his church. The book is called "Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory" by Tod Bolsinger. I was fascinated by the premise of the book and decided to order it right away.

And I am glad I did! The main premise of the book is based on what happened to Lewis and Clark as they traversed the Louisiana Purchase in search of a water route for trade to the Pacific Ocean. When they got to what we now know as the Rocky Mountains, they assumed that the mountains would be like the Appalachian Mountains that they were used to. They thought that all they had to do is crest the top of the mountains and they would encounter a water route of some sort that they could put their canoes on and make their way to the Pacific Ocean. What they discovered is that when they got to the top of the mountain, there were just more mountains! There wasn't a water route in sight, and now they not only had to figure out how to continue to traverse the mountains, but also what to do with the canoes.

As we move into a new season in the life of Bridgeport Christian Church, both post-COVID and post-fire, I believe that it is important that we learn, discuss, and create new ways for us to reach out into the community, as well as do ministry together. We live in a world now where the church is no longer the center of community life. We live in a world where people are deconstructing their faith and trying to figure out who God is in new ways. We live in a world where Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights are no longer "sacred." And we have to adapt.

Starting October 12, our elders will be doing a 5-week study of the book "Canoeing the Mountains." It is my hope that this will give us a jumping-off point into discussing how we can do ministry in uncharted territory. If you have ideas for a ministry opportunity or a program idea for Bridgeport, please reach out to one of the elders. This is not something we can do alone.

It is my hope and prayer that, by working and dreaming together, we can bring life and vitality to our church and look forward to our next 175 years. As always, it is an honor and a privilege to serve as your minister.

Recovery Update

The reconstruction of the damaged areas of our church building is scheduled to begin in early October. Our contractor, ServiceMaster, initially will focus on the sanctuary with the hope that we will be able to return there to worship by the middle of January while work continues on the rest of the building.

At this writing, the recovery working group is scheduled to meet soon to discuss next steps. A congregational meeting to vote on matters related to the recovery effort has been scheduled for Sunday, October 15, immediately following worship at The Evergreen; you will hear more about this in the weeks to come.



Green News BCC Joins National Creation Care Campaign

"One Home, One Future," a multi-faith campaign for creation care, will launch Wednesday, October 4, at 7 p.m. As part of our Green Chalice Ministry, Bridgeport Christian is joining "One Home, One Future," a coalition of American faith denominations and organizations with ecoAmerica's Blessed Tomorrow organizing the seven-year program.

Joining "One Home, One Future" gives us access to a rich array of free information, tools and guidance; seven accessible pathways for action, and connection with congregations nationwide working to care for our shared home. The seven pathways to action are:

1. Build Thriving Congregations: Decide which of the campaign pathways or items from your denomination ministries (Green Chalice) are motivating and accessible.

2. Empower Leaders and Youth: Host a listening session to hear youth ideas for creation care, or deepen your knowledge about Climate and Faith by taking the Ambassador Training Program. (Visit blessedtomorrow.org)

- 3. Engage & Strengthen Communities: Collaborate with neighboring congregations to organize a creation care event in your community; create spaces to talk about solutions.
- 4. Work Toward Justice: Learn about climate justice; form a Creation Justice task force in your congregation to build knowledge and engagement on the topic.
- 5. Restore Healthy Creation: Plan an activity that gets your congregation involved in stewardship of nature around your house of worship or in your local community.
 - 6. Strengthen Resilience & Preparedness: Download resources and make a plan for visible, cost-saving, and easy changes you and your congregation can make today.
 - 7. Allocate for Climate: Identify actions you and/or your congregation can take to shift spending toward sustainable products and services or help a less fortunate neighbor or congregation to do the same.

The website OneHomeOneFuture.org/Act has more than 100 resources. As a Green Chalice Congregation, we have taken steps to implement some of these actions. We can consider many others from the list to ensure a future home for generations to come.

I invite you to visit the site and reach out to share with me, Pastor Ann, or any member of our Green Team ideas that interest and motivate you.

Upon joining "One Home, One Future," we received a banner that was installed on Sunday, September 24. The picture of the installation has been submitted to be featured in the October 4 national webinar launch. To participate in the webinar, join at <u>OneHomeOneFuture.org</u>. You will then receive a confirmation with a link to join the launch. Together, we are called by our faith to care for our given and shared home and to work for a healthy world in a changing climate.
