Minister's Moment

This month, for Minister's Moment, I have invited Anita Bolen, leader of our ChiRho/CYF group, to share an experience that she and the youth had at the Regional Martin Luther King Jr. event, held on January 15, 2023.

On January 15, I was privileged to take some of our Chi Rho/CYF students to the Martin Luther King Jr. event sponsored by the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) Kentucky. The speaker was Devine Carama, and I must say at first I was skeptical that he would have anything to say that was meaningful to me. Let me explain why. According to his biographic information, Devine Carama is a nationally-renowned 2022 Emmy Award-winning hip-hop artist, educator, community activist, and motivational speaker from Lexington, Ky. He is currently employed by the Lexington mayor's office as the director of One Lexington. When I read this, I thought, "What does a hip-hop artist have to offer me? I don't listen to this, but the kids do, so we'll go."

I must say emphatically that I was wrong. He was a powerful speaker from the beginning. His message was concise and to the point, and one that not only our youth needed to hear, but one every adult in the room needed. Devine Carama reminded me what it meant to be a Christian without preaching to me. Every youth and adult was listening, and in a roomful of teens, not a single cell phone was in sight.

This is the core of his message.

Be Yourself: Nobody can be you. God created you to be you and only you. You tend to get comfortable with like people and their messages, but God sometimes sends you different messages in different ways. You need to look for common ground with others, even though you are different. That way, you are open to new messages. It is OK to be you! Be the best version of YOU with confidence.

Believe in something: What do you believe in that's bigger than you? What do you believe in so much that you will work for it even if you won't see the results? Some examples he gave were Martin Luther King Jr. and Rosa Parks – people who believed in a cause and were champions for it even though they never saw the final results.

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Be brave: Are you brave enough to do the right thing even if it's not the popular thing? Are you brave enough to speak up when someone says something that is disrespectful to others or does something against your moral code even when you may lose a friend or when it's not the popular train of thought in that crowd? Are you brave enough to be you instead of blending in with everyone else?

Balance: It's not just about being a leader, but how you lead. In order for things to change, you have to stand up. You need to find balance in your life. Leadership isn't about you – it's about how you defuse the situation and challenge the thinking at the same time. How you talk to others about others plants seeds – you can convey a message positively without being disrespectful. Be open to having a conversation about difficult topics, and keep an open mind to others' ideas – you may learn something in the process. Things are not black and white; true leadership is in the gray area.

He then asked the youth six questions. He told them the first three were for a \$100 cash prize, but they had to know the answer without looking at their phones.

Question 1. What was the brand of suit and shoes that Martin Luther King Jr. was wearing on the day he was assassinated? The group looked at him like he was crazy, and he laughed and said, that's all right, I don't know either.

Question 2. What brand of purse was Rosa Parks carrying on the bus? Again, they are thinking he is crazy, and no hands went up, because, really, who knows the answer to that question?

Question 3. How many followers does LeBron James have on Twitter? Some went for their phones, but he called them on it quickly and said they had to know immediately. OK, the money round is over, and we have three more questions.

Question 4. By show of hands, how many of you have heard, either from parents or in school, about Martin Luther King Jr. and what he did during the Civil Rights movement? All hands went up.

Question 5. By show of hands, how many of you have heard, either from parents or in school, about Rosa Parks refusing to give up her seat on the bus? Again, all hands went up.

Question 6. How many of you know that LeBron James has started a school to educate children? About half the room raised their hands.

Then he told then that they had taught him something just then, and it was a powerful learning moment.

You won't be remembered for your clothes, shoes, or number of followers on Twitter. You will be remembered for the actions you take and what you do in your life.

This is a message we all need to consider. It is not just for our youth, but also for our elders, and everyone in between.

The things I learn when working with the Chi Rho/CYF sometimes are reminders of how to live, and sometimes they are life changing. This speaker, who I was ready to blow off because he was a hip-hop artist, changed my life and left me with questions that I am still thinking about.

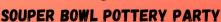

Green News

Need a suggestion for Lent?

As the Lenten season approaches, we ask ourselves, "What will I give up for Lent?" After all, Lent is about sacrifice. Just as Christ made the ultimate sacrifice for us, we give up something to improve our physical and spiritual well-being as a reflection of our love for God. Typically, we think of fasting from a particular food, activity or habit. Why not use this Lent to make your lifestyle greener, to shrink your carbon footprint? Below are some ideas for observing Lent in a "greener" way - one that shows love for God, neighbor, and God's creation.

1. Cut meat consumption. Try going meatless at least one day a week - Meatless Monday. Learn about the horrors of concentrated animal agriculture and its environmental effects. Lent might be the perfect time to dive into meat-free eating. (See recipe)

2. Go zero-waste or plastic-free. See how little garbage (including recycling!) you can generate between now and Easter. If that's too much, focus simply on eliminating plastic as much as possible. Pledge to take your own coffee cup or refillable water bottle to work each day.
3. Reduce food waste. Strive to use all the food you buy before any goes bad. Try to cook

through the contents of your pantry and freezer, places where food items often get forgotten.
4. Cook from scratch for all of Lent. See if you can make all your meals at home until Easter. Not only will you cut down on food waste, but you'll probably save some money while you're at it.
5. Try the 100-mile diet. For Lent, source only ingredients that come from within a 100-mile radius of your home. An added challenge is expanding that criterion to all aspects of your life, i.e. clothes, household accessories, etc.

 6. "Fast" from excess water use. Pay close attention to your water footprint and try to eliminate it as much as possible through conservation, collecting rainwater, and reusing grey water. (Reducing or eliminating meat consumption plays a big role in water reduction, as it's the main culprit.)

The final question to ask ourselves at Easter, the end of Lent, is "Have I made a temporary or permanent change?"

Cheesy Skillet Lasagna

1 (24-oz) jar low-sodium marinara sauce 2 (10-oz) pkgs refrigerated spinach ravioli 3 cups shredded mozzarella cheese 1 Tbsp dried Italian seasoning 1/2 cup pesto sauce (like Barilla)



1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F

2. Spread 1 cup sauce on bottom of a 10- or 12- inch cast iron or oven-safe skillet. Top with half of ravioli, 1 cup cheese, 1 cup sauce, and 1/2 Tbsp Italian seasoning. Spoon 1/4 cup pesto evenly on top.

3. Repeat layers ending with remaining 1 cup cheese. Bake 20 min. covered loosely with foil. Remove foil and bake another 20 min. or until hot and slightly browned. Cool 10 minutes. Serves 6. Dear Bridgeport Christian Friends,
